

### Support for parents

Our school has an open door policy to parents ensuring we are always approachable so parents feel involved in the education of their child. We aim to regularly involve parents in the education of their child through a variety of different ways including:

- The class teacher is always available to discuss the pupil's progress or any concerns and to share information about what is working well at home and school so similar strategies can be used.
- At the termly Parent's meetings, the SEN pupil's Individual Provision Map, detailing their targets and the provision that they receive, is discussed and assessed and the parent's views are sought.
- Meetings are held with the SENCO for children with an Education and Health Care Plan and the parents' views are sought regularly.
- Homework is adapted to support the pupil's individual needs. A Home reading diary and a home/school book (if necessary) is provided to inform parents of important information. All parents receive school and class newsletters.
- All information from outside professionals is discussed with the parent/carer or where this is not possible, in a report.

The school works together with statutory and voluntary agencies who also support children and families. Parents are advised of local Parent support groups including SENDIASS. SENDIASS provides information and support for parents/carers with a focus on children who have been identified as having SEN. SENDIASS provide a range of services in order to empower parents to play an active and informed role in their child's education, and to represent the needs, views and opinions of parents/carers when working together with statutory and voluntary agencies.
